Introduction

The second one day camp was successfully conducted on November 26, 2025, in Village Sumel under the theme “*Constitution Day: Building Responsible and Drug-Free Youth.*” The camp aimed to spread awareness about the significance of Constitution Day, promote understanding of Fundamental Rights and Duties, and sensitise the rural community about the harmful effects of drug abuse. The program witnessed active participation from student volunteers and enthusiastic engagement from the villagers. Dr Sugandha Verma, Programme Officer, NSS coordinated and conducted the event. Dr. Rani Sharma, Mr. Vijit Singh, Ms. Chahana Chaturvedi and Dr Surbhi Jain, faculty coordinators from each department of the university provided active support. Dr Pratima Soni, PI-UBA, IUJ also formed part of the team.

Objectives of the Camp

1. **To create awareness about Constitution Day** and promote understanding of Fundamental Rights and Fundamental Duties among the villagers.
2. **To assess and enhance general awareness** of constitutional values and civic responsibilities within the rural community.
3. **To educate youth and villagers about the harmful effects of drug abuse** and encourage the adoption of a drug-free lifestyle.

Activities Conducted

The camp began with two NSS volunteers addressing the rest of the volunteers and telling them about Fundamental rights and duties. Volunteers were later taken to Sumel village where they interacted with local residents and introduced the theme and purpose of the visit. The volunteers visited various parts of the village, including local shops, and engaged shopkeepers and villagers in discussions about Fundamental Rights and Duties as enshrined in the Constitution of India.

To assess the level of awareness, volunteers asked questions related to basic constitutional rights and duties. The responses provided insight into the general understanding of the villagers. Based on their answers, volunteers further explained the importance of rights such as the Right to Equality, Right to Freedom, and duties such as respecting the Constitution, promoting harmony, and safeguarding public property. Pamphlets were also distributed to the villagers.

An engaging nukkad natak focusing on anti-drug awareness was presented by the student volunteers at the village chouraha. The performance creatively highlighted the physical, social, and economic consequences of drug abuse and emphasised the importance of making responsible choices. The play was watched by by-standers and effectively conveyed its message through impactful dialogue and relatable scenarios.

Outcomes of the Camp

1. **Increased Awareness:** Villagers demonstrated improved understanding of Fundamental Rights and Duties after the interactive sessions and explanations.
2. **Positive Community Engagement:** Active participation from shopkeepers and residents indicated interest in constitutional values and civic responsibilities.
3. **Enhanced Awareness Against Drug Abuse:** The nukkad natak sensitised the youth and villagers about the dangers of drug consumption, encouraging a commitment toward a drug-free lifestyle.

The second one day camp conducted in Village Sumel on November 26, 2025, was a meaningful and impactful initiative. Through interactive discussions, awareness assessment, and a powerful street play, the camp effectively promoted constitutional values and the message of building responsible, drug-free youth.
