In reference to the initiative proposed by the ICFAI University, Jaipur under Unnat Bharat Abhiyan, UBA Cell of the university has successfully organized two skill development programs named “English Communication Skills Development Programme” and “Basic Computer Learning Programme” June,2024. The motive behind this Skill Development Programme is to develop basic skills and raise the level of confidence in regard to English Language and general computer awareness among the students residing in the adopted villages of the ICFAI University, Jaipur. This 3-Weeks programme started as scheduled on the 3rd of June, 2024 and successfully concluded on 24th June, 2024 with the distribution of certificates.

On the last day ceremony of the event; Hon’ble President Prof. Dr. H P Singh (VSM) of the ICFAI University, Jaipur praised the initiative and motivated the participants with his inspiring words and also emphasized on the importance of such skill development programs. Ms. Sugandha Verma of the ICFAI University, Jaipur has been appointed as the Faculty-Coordinator for teaching English and Mr. Shiwam Pratap Singh for the computer session. In their opinion students from different villages have shown their full interest in this Programme and want more programs like this in future also.

2. Class room Activities

A. English Communication Skills Development Programme:

Ms. Sugandha Verma, Assistant Professor, The ICFAI University, Jaipur was the Faculty Coordinator of the Training Programme. Classes were conducted in lecture mode as well as in Language Lab. The Language lab provided the students with a novel experience, giving them the opportunity to learn in a self-paced environment. The training programme began with an icebreaker activity designed to see if students could listen, understand and follow concise instructions given in English. This was followed by an assessment to gauge their existing reading and writing skills. A discussion was held on the basis of this assessment with the objective to help students improve their vocabulary, spellings, sentence structures and spoken English. Lectures and practice exercises on 'Parts of Speech' helped students in becoming familiar with the concept and grasping its importance in written and spoken English. Subsequently these classes focused on vocabulary and speaking skills and students were aided in this endeavor by their practice sessions in the Language lab. Role play activities where students were asked to write a short conversation between people meeting for the first time and enact it in the class helped them gain confidence. Students were also coached and guided on how to write a self-introduction. Learners were assisted in these activities by the Faculty Coordinator. Final classes made the students familiar with common sentences that maybe used in school, classroom and while travelling from one place to another. A test was conducted to carry out a final assessment of the students.

B. Basic Computer Learning Programme:

Three weeks' computer fundamentals classes for the village students, designed to equip students with essential skills in basic computer operations and popular software applications such as Microsoft Word, Excel, and Paint.
