August 9, 2024 – August 15, 2024



The NSS Unit of The ICFAI University, Jaipur celebrated the "Rashtriya Swabhiman Jagran Saptaah" from August 9, 2024 to August 15, 2024. Various activities were organised as part of this week. NSS Volunteers participated in Tree Plantation activity, Essay Writing Competition, Visit to Apna Ghar Ashram, Documentary watch and spreading awareness about the role of freedom fighters in the struggle of Indian independence. Prof. (Dr.) H. P. Singh, VSM, President, the ICFAI University, Jaipur (IUJ) presided over all events and encouraged the students to imbibe the spirit of the National Service Scheme. Ms. Sugandha Verma, Programme Officer, NSS coordinated and conducted the events. Dr. Rani Sharma, Mr. Vijit Singh, Ms. Chahana Chaturvedi and Mr. Surendra Mehra, faculty coordinators from each department of the university provided active support.

August 9, 2024: The NSS Unit organised a Tree Plantation activity on Day I of the programme in which NSS volunteers planted twenty trees in the university campus. The programme was also the inaugural event for the NSS unit. The objective of the activity was to contribute to environmental conservation and promote awareness about the importance of trees. The aim was to encourage the NSS Volunteers to reflect on Gandhiji's principles and their applicability in the contemporary Indian society. Singh, VSM, President, IUJ awarded certificates to the winners.







August 13, 2024: A visit to the "Apna Ghar" Ashram was organised on Day III of the programme. The Ashram is an old age home having the capacity to house 50 people. It is located in Jamdoli, Jaipur. The Ashram provides facilities such as treatment, food, clothes, residence and other necessities to its residents without any charges. Ms. Kavita Meena, Vice-President of the Ashram enlightened the students about the Ashram's initiative. The visit was organised with the objective of fostering a sense of social responsibility among the NSS volunteers. NSS volunteers visited the Ashram and interacted with the residents. The interactions were aimed at understanding their needs, sharing stories, and providing emotional support. Students also bought handmade 'rakhis' and other objects from the residents of the Ashram, thus contributing to the economic ecosystem of the Ashram.

















August 14, 2024: A documentary watch session was organised on Day IV of the programme featuring the documentary "Pilgrimage to Freedom". The session was organised in the seminar hall of the university.
