

A Report on House Hold Survey and Door to Door campaign Organised by UBA Cell, The ICFAI University, Jaipur

The Unnat Bharat Abhiyan (UBA) Cell of, ICFAI University Jaipur, recently conducted a door-to-door legal awareness campaign and house hold survey in Mangarh Khokhawala aimed at understanding and addressing the local issues faced by the rural population. Mr. Ashish Sharma also offered guidance on addressing potential legal issues highlighted by the villagers, bridging the gap between legal education and practical application.

Findings: The students documented a range of issues voiced by the villagers, including access to basic amenities, healthcare, and education, as well as legal concerns such as domestic

Violence. These findings will serve as a foundation for future actions and possible collaborations between the university's UBA cell and local authorities.

Conclusion: The door-to-door campaign and house hold survey was a successful initiative, reflecting the ICFAI university commitment to community involvement and social responsibility. Through this experience, students gained hands-on insights into rural challenges, while also contributing to the welfare of the village community. The collaboration with DSLA and Mr. Ashish's involvement further enriched the learning process, setting a benchmark for future UBA activities at ICFAI University Jaipur.
