August 12, 2024

This was followed by a session by Ms. Chahana Chaturvedi on the topic "Liberal Arts". The expert talk aimed to shed light on the growing scope of Liberal Arts, and its relevance in the present day.



August 14, 2024 Exposure Visit: Bhamashah Technohub



An exposure visit to the Bhamashah Technohub was organized with the objective of providing the students exposure to this thriving start-up ecosystem. The Bhamashah Technohub has been instrumental in providing support system to the individuals aspiring to become entrepreneurs and helping them pitch ideas and connect with potential investors. August 16, 2024



The first session was conducted by Ms. Sugandha Verma, Assistant Professor, ISLA on the National Service Scheme (NSS) and the Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) IDs. The session was aimed at familiarising new students with these essential initiatives. Ms. Verma equipped the students with the knowledge of how to effectively participate in the NSS for personal and societal benefit, as well as how to manage their academic credits through the ABC system.

August 20, 2024



The session was conducted by Mr. Manish Saxena, AGM Corporate Relations, ICFAI University, Jaipur accompanied by Mr. Biju Gopinath, Deputy Manager, Placements and Mr. Akhil Vijay, Assistant Manager, Placements. The session aimed to provide students with the opportunity to gain insights into career opportunities, working of the placement cell of the university. The session focused on Job Placement, coordinating with companies to arrange job interviews and campus recruitment drives for students, internship opportunities, resume writing, and interview preparation.



A session on 'Start-ups Ventures' was conducted by Dr Manisha Kaushik, Associate Professor at SKIT, Jaipur. The primary focus was on understanding the start-up ecosystem, identifying key challenges, and exploring strategies for growth and sustainability. The session aimed to educate participants about the start-up lifecycle, discuss common pitfalls and strategies for overcoming them and provide actionable advice on fundraising, market research, and scaling.



Dr. Pratima Soni, Associate Dean, ICFAI Law School conducted a session on 'Sexual Harassment' for the students of ICFAI School of Liberal Arts.
